Justin's importance to the history of his culture and people is such that a documentary is currently being made about him, and he is very active in the local school teaching the younger children their language, so it does not get lost or forgotten.

Justin decided only last year in 2010 to begin painting and translating his cultural knowledge and markings onto canvas.

We are delighted that a work of Justin Puruntatameri's from the exhibition has been acquired into the Holmes A Court collection.

Munupi Artists exhibition highlights:

Nina was delighted that the largest work she has painted in her long artistic career sold prior to opening and will be going to the USA. It inspired her to begin another large work upon her return.
