You may be aware that over the last several years the Federal Government, now through the Australia Council is looking at developing a Code of Conduct for the Indigenous Art industry to ensure ethical practice is adhered to and maintained.

Artitja Fine Art have from the beginning been supportive of this process and recently attended the Perth meeting of the Australia Council whose representatives have been touring the country seeking feedback from all involved in Indigenous art towards their finalising the Code. It is envisaged the Code will be in place by July this year.
